1. Compare Alma's message to different people To people of Zarahemla: "To gain salvation, men must <u>repent</u> and <u>keep the commandments</u>, be born again, cleanse their garments through the blood of Christ, be <u>humble</u> and strip themselves from <u>pride</u> and <u>envy</u>, and do the works of righteousness—The Good Shepherd calleth his people—Those who do evil works are children of the devil—Alma testifies of the truth of his doctrine and commands men to repent—Names of the righteous shall be written in the book of life." (5:Heading)

"The Church in Zarahemla is cleansed and set in order" (6:Heading)

To people of Gideon: "Christ shall be born of Mary—He shall loose the bands of death and bear the sins of his people—Those who repent, are baptized, and keep the commandments shall have eternal life—Filthiness cannot inherit the kingdom of God—Humility, faith, hope, and charity are required." (7:Heading)

⁶ I trust that ye are not in a state of so much *unbelief* as were your brethren; I trust that ye are *not lifted up in the pride* of your hearts; ... that ye have *not set your hearts upon riches* and the vain things of the world; yea, ... that you do *not worship idols*, but that ye do worship the true and the living God. (7:10)

Jesus "shall be born of Mary, <u>at Jerusalem</u> which is the <u>land of</u> <u>our forefathers</u>." (7:6)

¹¹ He shall go forth, suffering <u>pains</u> and <u>afflictions</u> and <u>temptations</u> of every kind; and this that the word might be fulfilled which saith he will take upon him the <u>pains</u> and the <u>sicknesses</u> of his people. ¹² And he will take upon him <u>death</u>, that he may loose the bands of death which bind his people; and he will take upon him their <u>infirmities</u>, that his bowels may be filled with mercy, ... that he may know according to the flesh <u>how to</u> <u>succor</u> his people according to their infirmities. (7:11–12)

How is this relevant to us?

To people of Melek: ⁴ He began to teach the people throughout all the land of Melek. ⁵ And ... the people came to him. ... And they were baptized throughout all the land. (Alma 8)

To people of Ammonihah: (Alma 8)

⁹ Satan had gotten great hold upon the hearts of the people of the city of Ammonihah; therefore they would not hearken unto ... Alma. ... ¹¹ They hardened their hearts, saying ... we are not of thy church, and we do not believe in such foolish traditions. ... thou hast no power over us. ... ¹³ [They] reviled him, and spit upon him, and caused that he should be <u>cast out</u> of their city.

- What was their church, its teachings and scripture? (16:11)

¹⁴ While Alma was thus weighed down with sorrow, behold an angel ... appeared unto him, saying: ¹⁵ Blessed art thou, Alma; therefore, lift up thy head and rejoice, ... for thou hast been <u>faithful in keeping the commandments of God from the time</u> <u>which thou receivedst thy first message</u> from him. Behold, I am he that delivered it unto you. ¹⁶ ... Return to the city of Ammonihah, and preach again. ... Yea, say unto them, <u>except</u> <u>they repent</u> the Lord <u>God will destroy them</u>. ¹⁷ For behold, they do study at this time that they may destroy the liberty of thy people.

3. Alma's Message to Ammoniahites (Alma 9)

¹ As I began to preach ..., they began to contend with me, saying: ² ... Suppose ye that we shall believe the <u>testimony of one man</u>? ... We will not believe thy words if thou shouldst prophesy that this great city should be destroyed in <u>one day</u>. ... Who is God, that sendeth no more authority than one man among this people, to declare unto them the truth of such great and marvelous things?

⁸ O ye wicked and perverse generation, how have ye <u>forgotten</u> the tradition of your fathers; yea, how soon ye have <u>forgotten</u> the commandments of God."

¹⁵ It shall be <u>more tolerable for [the Lamanites] in the day of</u> <u>judgment than for you</u>, if ye remain in your sins, yea, and even more tolerable for them in this life than for you, except ye repent.

"The beauty of this mathematical configuration is its simplicity. The values of 1, 2, 4, and 7 can be expressed with the use of a single piece, and the values 3, 5, 6, 8, 9, 11, and 14 can be achieved with only two, while values of 10, 12, 13, 15, 16, and 18 can all be formed by using only 3 in combination. Not until one exceeds 13 does one need two of the same weights. ... 

- Look down on, mock, scorn, or pick on others.
- Provoke others to anger. (Top 10 ways) Hurt people hurt people.
- Pat ourselves on the back.
